Student Attendance

Every Learner, Every Day is a campaign designed to raise awareness about the importance of school attendance for every student, on every school day and to promote a healthy attendance culture.

One of the biggest contributors is the large number of parents seeking to take their children out of school for overseas holidays. Please plan for holidays outside of the school term. **Coming to school is critical to student achievement and wellbeing.**

Parents are reminder that they must **send a note** in to the classroom teacher to explain any absence from school. The class roll is a legal document and we need to have an explanatory note signed by the parent.

On Time Every Day - Partial absences = missed learning. Let your child known that every day counts by recognising punctuality, get to school on time every day to ensure that your child does not miss out on important morning structures and learning time. If your child is late to school (that is, arrives at school after 8:50am) then it is essential that a parent accompanies the child into the school office to fill in a partial absence form and get a late pass before going to class.

Kiss and Drop Zone

Parents are asked to display their car sign (Name tag) on the passenger side visor so that it is visible to the teachers on duty, making it easier to call your child.

We ask for your patience, particularly in the first few weeks when the new Kindergarten students and parents adjust to the kiss and drop procedures.

In the afternoon, names will begin to be called at 3:05pm. Please wait until 3:10pm (which is the official end of the school day) before driving off, as the school is responsible for the safety of your child until the 3:10pm bell rings. If you need to leave early, then parents are asked to come into the school office and fill out a partial absence form and sign your child out for the day.

Please obey traffic rules and respond to the teachers on duty if they ask you to go around the block. The procedures we have put into place are for the safety of all, and safety is our number one priority.

Uniform Transition

There is a 2 year transition period for the new uniform to become compulsory, therefore at the start of the 2020 school year the expectation would be that all students have transitioned to the new uniform. In the meantime, during these transition years, mixing and matching of uniforms will be acceptable. *Eg if your child has the older uniform but has grown out of their sports jacket, it would make sense for you to purchase the new jacket to wear with the older uniform.*

Tuckshop2U

Online ordering for Morning tea and Lunch is available from Tuckshop2U from Monday to Friday, with hot food options being available on Thursdays only.

Just a reminder that in purchasing your child's tuckshop order online, you are contracting directly with the supplier. You are responsible for checking that the ingredients of what you order are not incompatible with your child's sensitivities or health issues. Please ensure you check the disclaimers in the supplier's website. If in doubt you should contact the supplier.

As the weather is very warm, it is a good idea to place an ice brick in your child's lunchbox to keep the food cool. While, our bags are mainly kept inside or in shade, it is just a healthy precaution to take to ensure the quality of the healthy lunches that you pack are not compromised by the heat.

Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Executive Director Greg Whitby has been recognised in this year's Australia Day Honours list with his appointment as a Member in the General Division of the Order of Australia (AM). The award recognises Greg's outstanding contribution to education. Since 2006, Greg has led a system of 80 Catholic schools in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains. As an innovative educator and educational leader, he is internationally recognised for his passion about rethinking school for the digital age and the role of learning environments and technology in supporting learning and teaching. On learning of his achievement this Australia Day, Greg was deeply moved by the award.

"This recognition belongs to those who have worked with me to transform education over the past forty years," Greg said. "I've been inspired by great teachers and outstanding leaders who are committed to doing the very best for young people in Australian schools.

"I've been inspired by great teachers and outstanding leaders who are committed to doing the very best for young people in Australian schools. "It's been a privilege to be a part of the great mission of schooling. I look forward to continuing to turn around what it means to educate students today for their world."

In support of Greg Whitby's nomination for the prestigious award, Most Rev Vincent Long Van Nguyen OFM Conv, Bishop of Parramatta, reflected on Greg's strong commitment to equity, praising his 'unflinching advocacy for the young people of Western Sydney and their families'. Greg has previously been recognised with a Papal Knighthood in the Order of St Gregory the Great for his outstanding contribution to Catholic education. He is also a Fellow of the Australian Institute of Management. Greg was named the most innovative educator in

the Australian College of Educators, the Australian Council for Educational Leaders and the Australian Institute of Management. Greg was named the most innovative educator in Australia by the Bulletin Magazine in its annual SMART 100 awards and in 2017. In the same year, he was awarded the Sir Harold Wyndham Medal for his contribution to the education of young people in NSW.
