### Luke 15

#### The Parable of the Lost Sheep

Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathering around to hear Jesus. But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them."

Then Jesus told them this parable: "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbours together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent."

In Stage One, students have been learning about the importance of forgiveness through our Religious Education unit 'Reconciliation: Belonging to a forgiving community. Students are making a deep connection through the three senses of Scripture. Literal, where they listen and read parables of Jesus such as the 'Lost Sheep'. Spiritual, where they make connections to the Sacrament of Reconciliation and finally, through the sense of Application where students are able to describe how their choices and actions effect their relationship with God and others. We were lucky enough to have Deacon Jack come in to assist in deepening the students understanding of Reconciliation.
