# Corinthians 12:4-11

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

Stage Two are currently learning about the way Jesus shares His gifts. This scripture passage informs us that God's many gifts are handed out everywhere; but they all originate in God's Spirit. His expressions of power are in action everywhere, but He is behind it all. Each person around us is given something to do that shows who God is. All of these gifts and talents are handed out by the Spirit, and to all kinds of people!

*Extension question:* What 3-digit palindrome can you add to 2017 and get a 4-digit palindrome as your answer? 535 is the answer. 2017 + 535 = 2552 (4-digit palindrome)
